Swimming review

Q1: What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort can swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres?

A1: 80% of the children have achieved their level 2 or 3 swimming certificates. The rest have achieved a confidence in water certificate.

Q2: What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort can use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke, and breaststroke]?

A2: 70% of children can swim using more than 1 different technique. The rest are continuing to practise.

Q3: What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort are able to perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations? Priority should always be given to ensuring that pupils can perform safe self-rescue even if they do not fully meet the first two requirements of the National Curriculum programme of study

A3: 80%. Further development will be needed and assessed.
